Since 2021, Vienna has come together to celebrate the four Liberty Amendments that brought our nation closer to that ideal of a "more perfect union." That year, Liberty Amendments Month was officially recognized as a statewide commemoration by unanimous vote in the Virginia General Assembly and this year's celebration is focused on engaging, family friendly activities that help us appreciate our common bonds.

From our Juneteenth celebration commemorating the 13th Amendment to the Multicultural Festival that celebrates the liberties granted through the 14th and 15th amendments to activities that recognize the 19th Amendment granting voting rights to women, Liberty Amendments Month gives everyone an opportunity to reflect on the ideals that are at the heart of who we are as a nation. While the foundations of other countries have changed dramatically over time, "The Great Experiment" that our Founding Fathers crafted for the United States remains constant at the core, with a few tweaks along the way to ensure all citizens are granted equal liberties under the law as outlined in the U.S. Constitution.

Our system of government may be far from perfect, but it has survived the test of time and it continues to look in the mirror to make the necessary corrections that meet the changing dynamics of our cultural "melting pot." From Juneteenth to the third Monday in July each year, Liberty Amendments Month is an opportunity to reflect on our way of life, to test our assumptions about others who are different from us and to rededicate ourselves to the ideals of "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness," for all citizens. Abolition of Slavery

This amendment explicitly banned slavery and involuntary servitude in the United States. An exception was made for punishment of a crime. This amendment also gave Congress the power to enforce the article through legislation.

14th Amendment

June 22- June 28

Citizenship and equal rights

This amendment set out the definitions and rights of citizenship in the United States. The first clause asserted that anyone born or naturalized in the United States is a citizen of the United States and of the state in which they live. It also confirmed the right to due process, life, liberty, and property. This overturned the Dred Scott v. Sandford (1857) Supreme Court ruling which formally stated that Black people were not eligible for citizenship.

15th Amendment June 29- July 5

Voting Rights

This amendment prohibited governments from denying U.S. citizens the right to vote based on race, color, or past servitude. While the amendment provided legal protection for voting rights based on race, other means could be used to block Black citizens from voting. These included poll taxes and literacy tests. These methods were employed around the country to undermine the Civil War Amendments and set the stage for the Civil Rights Movement.

19th Amendment July 6- July 15

Extended women's rights to vote

This amendment declares that the right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of sex. Congress shall have the power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation. 2020 marked the 100th anniversary of this amendment.

Liberty Amendments Month

History and Milestones

Liberty Amendments Month annually commemorates the passage of the 13th, 14th, 15th, and 19th Amendments through a series of programs and events that brings together members of the community and celebrates the diverse heritage and history of the greater Vienna Community, Commonwealth of Virginia, and United States of America.

History and Milestones

June 2020 – Town Manager, Mercury Payton initiates the Liberty Amendments Month concept.

December 2020 – Mayor Linda Colbert and Vienna Town Council votes to observe Liberty Amendments Month annually from June 19 through the third Monday in July in Resolution # 009-2020.

January 2021 – The Virginia General Assembly adopted joint Resolution # 583 recognizing Liberty Amendments Month as a statewide observance.

June 19- July 19, 2021 – Town of Vienna and Liberty Amendments planning committee hosts inaugural Liberty Amendments Month which included 65 virtual and in-person events to more than 22,000 participants.

September 2021 – The Town of Vienna and Liberty Amendments Month receive Local Champion and President's Innovation Awards from the Virginia Municipal League.

May 2022 – Liberty Amendments Month wins First Place in the National Association of Government Communicators Blue Pencil, Gold Screen Awards.

June 2022 – Delegate Mark Keam, Senator Chap Petersen, and the Town of Vienna recognize Leigh Saunders Kitcher with a resolution and certificate of appreciation for outstanding leadership and dedication to Liberty Amendments Month.

June 18- July 19, 2022 – Town of Vienna and Liberty Amendments planning committee hosts second annual Liberty Amendments Month which included 35 virtual and in-person events to more than 11,000 participants.

March 2023 – Town of Vienna recognized with Historic Preservation Awards from Historic Vienna, Inc. for Liberty Amendments Month.
