OCTOBER 17,1988

- Following a public hearing, adopted amendments to the "Animals and Fowl" ordinance.
- Conducted a public hearing on a proposed ordinance to create a register of historic sites.
- Donated \$500 to the Greater Vienna Babe Ruth League.
- Approved the final plat of Trail Side Subdivision, Ninovan and Talahi Roads, S.E. The developer is to provide as-built drawings signed by a state-registered surveyor or professional engineer showing all grading and drainage work, including storm, sanitary and water pipe installations and invert elevations and elevations of pipe. The Town will contribute a sum not to exceed \$9,500 toward construction of storm drainage facilities on the north side of Talahi, currently consisting of a rip-rap junction between several pipes.
- Awarded a bid of \$6,780 to Virginia Turf and Equipment Company, Inc., of Woodbridge for a lawn tractor.
- Awarded the bid for an actuarial study to Milliman and Robertson of Washington, D.C.

Funding for the study is to come from the pension funds.

- Authorized the Town Manager to negotiate with Byers Engineering for a contract for utility locating services for FY 1988-89, at a cost of approximately \$18,700 per year.
- Authorized the Town Manager to negotiate a contract for leaf collection at a cost not to exceed \$31,700.

OCTOBER 24, 1988

- Adopted an ordinance requiring developers to place a bond for the protection of trees indicated for retention on subdivision plats.
- Adopted an ordinance permitting identification signs for townhouse developments.
- Denied an appeal by Trak Auto and upheld an appeal by Maple Avenue Shopping Center of decisions by the Architectural Review Board.
- Denied a request for a traffic signal at Maple Avenue and Westbriar Drive, N.E. A "No U Turn" sign will be installed westbound on Maple at St. Andrews Drive.
- Awarded a bid for tree maintenance and

removal to R.E. Martin Tree Specialist for a climbing crew at \$100 per hour, C&D Tree Service for an aerial bucket crew at \$135 per hour, and Fairfax Tree Service for stump grinding at \$40 per hour. The total cost is not to exceed \$15,000.

- Awarded a bid for a one-ton dump truck cab and chassis to World of Ford Sales at a price of \$12,348.
- Awarded a bid for brick steps and hand-rail rehabilitation at Town Hall to B&K Concrete in the amount of \$24,000.

Historic Register Established

The Town Council has adopted an ordinance to establish a register of Vienna's historic sites. These sites will be marked with a special plaque and described in a pamphlet.

Residents may apply to have their property included on the register by sending a letter to the Town Manager describing the site, its size and location, significant dates in its history, people or events of historic interest associated with it, and other pertinent information. The Town Council will act on applications after receiving recommendations from the Town Manager and the board of directors of Historic Vienna,

In considering applications, the following will be presumed as entitled to inclusion on the register:

-Buildings and other structures erected at their present locations prior to 1900 and which retain all or a substantial portion of their original dimension and appearance.

-Businesses continuously conducted in the Town of Vienna since prior to 1900 under the same name or in the same location.

-Sites and places that have been used continuously since prior to 1900 for the same purpose or have remained essentially unchanged since the discontinuation of such use.

The following structures, sites and places will also be considered for inclusion on the register:

-Those that are more than 50 years old and possess significance related to the founding or development of the town or to persons who have achieved local, regional or national prominence.

-Those that are over 50 years old and considered to be symbolic of the town's history by reason of their architecture or in the way they have been used.

-Those that are less than 50 years old but are considered so unusually or uniquely connected with the town's development as to qualify for inclusion on the register.

The purpose of the register is simply to encourage recognition of and interest in historic places within the town and does not constitute an "official designation" of any kind.

Lions Club members will be available to help purchasers select their trees and load them safely onto their cars between 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. seven days a week until all trees have been sold.



Here Are the Answers to the Question "When Do I Need to Obtain a Permit?"

The Town of Vienna requires homeowners, business owners and tenants to obtain a building permit whenever they wish to make significant improvements to their property. Such improvements include the installation of a new roof or siding, the erection of a storage shed or other accessory structure, and the construction of new facilities such as walls, fences, signs, hot tubs, building additions and the like.

The Department of Planning and Zoning receives about 100 building permit applications each month, and many of the questions received relate to when a building permit is required and how it is obtained. In general, any new construction, except painting, wallpapering and other minor cosmetic repairs, requires a building permit. A notable exception to this rule is the construction or placement of an accessory structure with a total area of less than 150 square feet on a single-family lot; the installation of such a structure does not require a building permit, but its location is restricted in accordance with setback requirements for each of the three residential zones.

All exterior construction, whether it is new or a modifi-

cation of an existing structure, must be reviewed and approved by the Board of Architectural Review before a building permit may be obtained. The only exception to this rule is construction of homes, building additions and accessory structures in singlefamily residential zones, where such approval is not required prior to submitting plans for a building permit.

INSPECTION SERVICES

The Town of Vienna does not provide building or fire inspection services. These services are provided, respectively, by the Fairfax County Department of Environmental Management and the County Fire and Rescue Department. The Town does, however, review all plans, documents and specifications along with the building permit application prior to its actual issuance by Fairfax County. The Town also performs a site and interior final inspection prior to issuing a certificate of occupancy.

Each application for residential building permits for construction of room additions, detached garages, accessory structures, decks (of any size and height), swimming pools and hot tubs must be accom-

panied by four complete sets of plans, specifications and a plot sheet, certificate of survey or house plat. The Departments of Planning and Zoning and Public Works will review this information (usually within 48 hours or less) and return three sets to the applicant to take to Fairfax County for approval.

An additional set of plans and considerably more detailed information is required for building permits involving commercial, industrial, public and semi-public land uses.

Permits must be obtained prior to installing walls and fences. Each application is reviewed and approved by the Directors of Planning and Zoning and Public Works. The applicant is provided with a copy of the permit after approval and payment of the permit fee.

SIGN PERMITS

Sign permits are required for all signs except "For Sale" and similar temporary signs less than six square feet in area and residential nameplates of less than one and a half square feet in area. Temporary political signs are, however, subject to sign permit requirements and other regulations as to location, number and size. All other signs must be approved by the Board of Architectural Review relative to specific standards and design criteria prior to obtaining a sign permit.

Any new land use, and the construction or alteration of buildings (with some exceptions in residential zones), requires a certificate of occupancy before the facility may be occupied. The Departments of Planning and Zoning and Public Works review applications for occupancy permits within 48 hours or less, depending on the nature of the application.
