Deadline for Donation Requests

Preparation of the Town's budget for next fiscal year will begin soon.

Non-profit organizations seeking donations of Town funds during fiscal year 1989-90 should submit their requests to the Town Manager by February 10. Requests must include the following information:

- Name of the organization and names and addresses of its principal officers.
- Purpose of the organization and a description of its programs and activities.
- Percentage members or participants who live in town or who own or are employed by town businesses.
- · Organization budget showing all income and expenses for the year in which the donation will be used.
- Amount of funding requested from the Town.
- Purpose for which the donation will be
- Synopsis of the fund-raising activities being conducted during the current year.

•Statement signed by the principal officer that membership or participation is open to all residents and business people in town without regard to race, national origin, religion or sex.

Beginning this month, town residents can call the Department of Public Works Special Pickup Line for disposal of unwanted furniture, building materials, appliances, brush and other debris not included in the regular trash collection. Call the Special Pickup recording at 255-5727 any time and be prepared to leave the following information:

-Your name;

-Your daytime phone number;

-Your address:

- -Location of debris if different from your address;
- -Amount of debris (limit one dumptruck load per pickup);

-Type of debris.

The Special Pickup will be made within five working days of your call.

Each residence is entitled to two free Special Pickups per year. Additional pickups will be made for \$40 each.

Business License Renewal

Business license renewal notices have been mailed out to all businesses within the corporate limits of the town. The deadline for paying the gross receipts tax and obtaining a 1989 business license is February 28. After that date, a 10% penalty is added to the tax due, with an additional 10% per annum interest applicable beginning in April. The tax is based on the previous year's (1988) gross receipts.

If a business has

been discontinued, or for some other reason the license is not being renewed, please contact the Business License Office so that records can be updated.

New businesses must apply for a business license, after first obtaining an occupancy permit from the Department of Planning and Zoning.

ID Bracelets for Memory Impaired Patients

If you have a loved one who suffers from Alzheimer's Disease or other form of memory impairment, then you should know about "Wrist Watch," a program to assist police in identifying persons who wander. Wrist Watch provides these individuals with bracelets engraved with essential information to reunite them with their families or caregivers.

Wandering is behavior of individuals with memory loss and can happen at any time of day, but especially after dark. Wanderers often look quite "normal," so the red medical symbol on bracelet alerts private citizens and police to check for health problems.

Vienna Zip Code Split


Vienna Postmaster Dempsey White has announced that three additional zip codes have been established to better serve postal customers with Vienna addresses. Extensive residential and business growth in Northern Virginia has prompted this action.

The current Vienna zip code is 22180 and serves more than 22,000 delivery addresses. This zip code will be split by forming three more codes - 22181, 22182 and 22183. Residents within the town's corporate limits will maintain the 22180 zip code. Zip codes for most postal customers in areas outside of town will be either 22181 or 22182. The new zip code for post office box holders is 22183. All Vienna customers will receive notification of their correct code.
