Town Government's 100th Year

The first woman elected to the Vienna Town Council was Clara Staats Barringer (1869-1935). She served the following terms: 1907-?, 1912-14, 1918-20, 1922-24.

Active in community affairs, a horsewoman, and a member of the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Vienna Presbyterian Church, she also assisted her husband in the operation of their farm. The couple had no children.

In 1907, she purchased the home that still stands at 340 Glyndon St., N.E., and where her nephew, Ryneer A. Staats, and his wife live today. Her neice, Marcia Staats, lives on Wilmar Place, N.W. The Staats homestead, where Marcia and Ryneer Staats grew up, was located on land now part of Westwood Country Club.

1939 Fine Week is the library's gift to patrons on the occasion of its 50th birthday. In the early days, the library charged a nickel fine for every two weeks a book was overdue.

Fairfax County Public Library was born on February 1, 1939, when the Board of Supervisors voted to allocate \$250 for establishing a countywide library system. From this beginning, the library has grown into a network of 22 branches with a \$16 million annual budget and 2 million materials.

Newspaper Pickup Program Pays

Town ordinance prohibits mixing newspapers with trash. Residents are encouraged to place their newspapers at the curbside every other week for recycling. Newspaper pickup days are listed in this newsletter each month.

Newspaper recycling not only helps conserve a valuable natural resource, but also generates revenue for the Town. Last fiscal year, 863.36 tons of newspaper were sold for recycling for

a profit of \$19,020.95. In addition, the Town saved the \$15,324.64 it would have cost to dispose of this quantity of newspaper at the Fairfax County landfill.

Newspapers should be tied in bundles or placed in paper (not plastic) bags for pick-up. Magazines, telephone directories and similar items are not recyclable and should not be mixed in with newspapers. For more information, call 255-6381.

We have arranged to conduct a four-hour CPR class at Madison High School on Sunday, February 12. Certified instructors will be available to train the participants in one-person CPR and the Heimlich Maneuver. Pre-registration is required and can be done by calling 691-4CPR before February 10.

The class will begin at 1:30 p.m. and continue until 5:30 p.m. Students should plan to arrive a few minutes early to pick up materials. Much of this training is hands-on activity, so wear comfortable clothing.

1989 Tax Forms

Every year at tax time, Patrick Henry Library stocks free tax forms for those who need extras. If the IRS didn't send the right forms, or if erasures left noticeable holes in your reporting, you can pick up fresh, new copies of the entire 1040 family of federal tax forms at the library.

Unlike previous years, however, the almost 60 types of supplemental tax forms, such as "Capital Gains and Losses" and "Credit for Child and Dependent Care Expenses," will not be offered in quantity. Taxpayers can order the forms through the mail from the IRS by calling 1-800-424-FORM, or photocopy originals in the library's collection for 10 cents each.

The goal is to make this special graduation party available to every senior. Some families are unable to afford the \$25 cost of a ticket. Last year, thanks to the generosity of the community, enough tickets were provided for students in financial need.

Concern Over Toxic Spills Grows

Fumes from a chemical spill in Bhopal, India, in 1984 killed over 2,000 people and injured many thousands more. This incident focused concern on whether communities in the U.S. are ready to respond to hazardous material emergencies.

In 1986, Congress passed the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act. The law provides for emergency response planning to cope with the accidental release of toxic chemicals into the air, land or water. The community right-to-know provisions will help to increase the public's knowledge and access to information

about the presence of hazardous chemicals in the community and releases of these into the environment. Businesses are now required to report their hazardous chemical inventories and releases.

Virginia now has over 105 Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPC). The Fairfax LEPC has begun collecting information about hazardous materials in the area and has drafted its first emergency response plan.
