


Santa's Got a New Ride

Council Votes to Defer Meals Tax Proposal

t its regular meeting on Monday, Nov. 18, 2024, at Town Hall, the Vienna Town Council voted to defer the proposal to temporarily raise the Town's meals tax from 3% to 4% to pay for design and construction of a new public pool and fitness facility. The Council's decision came after hearing views from 26 community members who voiced concerns about or support for the issue during a public hearing, which was extended to accept comments via email until Nov. 27. The Town Council will resume discussions at its next regular meeting on Dec. 9, 2024, at 7:30 p.m. at Vienna Town Hall, 127 Center St. S., Vienna, Va.

At issue is the proposal to raise the meals tax by 1% for a 10-year period beginning Jan. 1, 2025, to pay for the design and construction of a new aquatics and fitness facility. The center would be located on the former Town Annex site located at 301 Center St., S., which the Town purchased in 2020 from the former Faith Baptist Church. The Town Council deferred its decision on the meals tax proposal to allow more time for public comment, via email and to gather more information about the proposed facility's long-term operational costs.

The Town's current 3% meals tax is among the lowest in the region and pays for capital projects such as roads, building improvements and park projects. It applies to prepared, ready-to-consume meals, and does not apply to standard groceries. If the Council should approve the temporary increase to 4%, by law, it would return to 3% at the end of 10 years.

The temporary meals tax increase was used once before, from 2002 to 2008 to pay for the Vienna Town Green, which now serves as a central gathering space for public and private events and activities. Now, the Town Council believes a new aquatic and fitness center would further enhance the community's quality of life and fulfill a longstanding community wish. If the temporary 1% meals tax is approved, the facility would be constructed by 2030.

Board of Architectural Review (BAR) (1 Vacancy). This board examines and approves plans for commercial buildings, signs, and landscaping to ensure that new construction is appropriate and compatible with existing buildings. It also considers construction activities in residential zones.

Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) (1 Vacancy). The BZA is a semi-judicial body that holds public hearings on zoning variances and administrative appeals including granting special exceptions, conditional uses and variances to development standards.

Town Business Liaison Committee (TBLC) (2 Business Vacancies). The TBLC works with the Town's economic

development director to represent business-community concerns to elected Town officials and staff, the Vienna Business Association and residents at large.

> **Transportation Safety Commission** (TSC) (1 Vacancy). The TSC helps the Town work toward its goal of being an efficiently mobile, walkable and bikeable community by studying street safety issues and making recommendations to the Town Council.

Vienna Public Art Commission (VPAC) (1 Senior Student Vacancy). This commission advises and assists the Town Council on matters related to advancing

public art, including programs staged in public venues and public art funding.

Town's Finance Director to Retire after 25 Years of Service

f you've had to get a business license, paid a water bill, or just had a question about the Town's budget, chances are you've gotten to know Town of Vienna Finance Director, Marion Serfass. Over the last eight years, Marion has led the Town's finance department, spearheading the annual budget process and after more than 25 years with Vienna, including 17 years as the department's deputy director, Serfass is set to retire at the end of this year.

"I've loved serving our residents and I've had the pleasure of working with a great caliber of people during my time here in Vienna," said Serfass. "I'm proud of the work we've done, and I feel confident leaving the department in good hands, with the right people and systems in place."

Serfass, who, self-admittedly has a love of spreadsheets and crunching numbers, started out as a certified public accountant in the 1980s and worked for Marriott for 14 years as a regional controller before joining the Town in November 1999. "At the time, I had a small child and Vienna Town Hall was just a few blocks away from home. I love working with the public as well, so Vienna was a perfect fit for me then, and has been all these years since."

As finance director, Serfass oversaw significant projects, including revitalizing the Town's payment systems, streamlining financial operations, and leading the Town through the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic without any major financial disruptions. Under her leadership, the Town's finance department embraced automation, efficiency, and modernization.

"When I arrived, there was no voicemail here at Town Hall and hardly anyone used email," Serfass said. "We've come a long way since then. Finance is cyclical, but we're constantly trying to evolve and As for what's next, Serfass says she's

"I'm sad to leave the Vienna community" Serfass said, "but I'm excited to have an active retirement filled with new adventures like traveling, volunteering, and spending lots of time with family, who aren't far from our new home."

Serfass's last day will be Friday, Dec. 20, 2024. Steven Barlow, the Town's current Deputy Director of Finance, will succeed Serfass as the new director starting Monday, December 23, 2024.



ienna, c.1960. Greetings from the Maple Avenue Shopping Center! It sure looked different as depicted in this postcard found floating around in the Town archives. Super Giant sold far more than groceries in those days and operated more like a department store offering a wide range of other goods including clothing and record albums. By 1968, the store faced tough competition from a new concept in shopping – a regional, fully enclosed, climatecontrolled shopping mall down the street called Tysons Corner Center.

Hold the Salt - Protect the Environment!

hen Old Man Winter dumps ice on the region, use salt sparingly in your winter cleanup effort. Too much salt can harm animals, plants and aquatic life, cause vehicle corrosion and concrete deterioration, and contaminate water bodies and drinking water. Reduce the amount of salt you use by shoveling in stages as snow falls, applying salt only where it is really needed, or waiting for the sun to melt the snow and ice. A 12-ounce coffee mug full of rock salt is all you need to clear 10 sidewalk squares or a 20 ft driveway. Once the ice and snow are gone, be sure to clean up leftover salt to protect your property and the environment from harm.
