All Hands on Deck


his winter is shaping up to be a memorable one thanks to steady freezing temperatures and stubborn snow leftover from January's first winter storm. Fortunately, the season's first test was no match for the Town's efficient and hard-working snow removal crews from parks and recreation and public works.

"Our teams prepare for these sorts of events and have emergency plans in place to ensure the impacts of winter storms are mitigated," said Deputy Director of Operations, Marvin Lawrence. "All winter long, the Town's emergency management team tracks the forecast and keeps an open line of communication which helps inform our snow removal process and operating schedule decisions."

Ahead of a winter storm, brine trucks are deployed, and crews begin pre-treating all emergency routes and primary roads in town. Plowing begins when the snow reaches a depth of approximately two inches and roads are cleared based on their priority. Primary roads are cleared first, then secondary roads. The Town's parks and recreation staff clear sidewalks around Town properties.

12-hour shifts to remove snow and ensure our roads are safe to travel on," said Public Works Director, Brad Baer, "There's 130 lane miles of road in town, so if it takes crews a while to plow and treat your neighborhood, please know they are working diligently to get it done as soon as possible."

responsible for clearing the sidewalks in front of and adjacent to public buildings. residents and businesses are encouraged to shovel sidewalks in front of and adjacent to their homes and businesses.

Your Guide to Accessory Living Units in Vienna

he Vienna Town Council recently approved a zoning-code change that now allows single family homeowners to create accessory living units (ALUs) within their homes. This change took effect on Dec. 30, 2024. If you're planning on converting a portion of the basement into an apartment-like space for your college student or turning the garage into an in-law suite, please review this short summary of the new regulations:

Where can an Accessory Living Unit (ALU) be located?

- Internal to the principal structure on your property (home), such as within the basement.
- Attached to the principal structure (an addition or within an addition).
- Converted attached garage or second story above the attached garage.

*ALUs are not permitted within detached accessory structures.





What are other key **ALU regulations?**

- An ALU can be no more than 800 sq. ft. or 40% of the floor area of the principal structure (whichever is the lesser of the two) and no more than two bedrooms.
- Each ALU is required to have a living area, sleeping area, kitchen and bathroom.
- The entrance for the ALU must be located at the side or rear of the principal structure.
- There must be sufficient off street parking for both the primary residence and the ALU.
- No property may have both an ALU and an in-home day care.

I want to apply for an ALU. What's required?

- A completed applicant authorization form.
- A signed ALU policy acknowledgement form.
- A Fairfax County building application number for new or modified ALUs.
- The floorplan layout for the proposed ALU.
- Prior to final ALU approval, the Town will conduct an inspection.

*An ALU Certificate of Occupancy must be issued to the property owner prior to the establishment of the ALU as a residence.

How do I continue using an ALU?

- The property owner is required to re-apply for their ALU Certificate of Occupancy every two years.
- An inspection will be conducted prior to the issuance of the ALU Certificate of Occupancy.
- The property owner must reside in either the ALU or the principal structure it is attached to.

Investing in Our Community: Vienna's Budget


he Town of Vienna's budget is an important part of our local government. Through the budget process, we decide how to use our resources to keep our Town working well and invest in the future.

Hearing from the community is important to be sure that the Town government is making well-informed choices. In some recent opportunities for feedback, residents have asked questions about how the Town sets priorities and makes spending decisions. It's important that the Town shares that information clearly so that the community has helpful information about what is being considered.

Each year, the Town reviews spending by each department and decides what investments may be most appropriate for the Town through the **Operating Budget** and the **Capital Improvement Plan**.

The Operating Budget is focused on ongoing services and programs provided by the Town, such as water services and parks and recreation offerings. Virginia state law requires localities that do not operate a school division to have a budget enacted by June 30 each year for the new operating year that begins on July 1. Through this process, the Town Council decides the real estate tax rate, water and sewer rates, funding levels and staffing for each department, and new initiatives, all while maintaining a "Rainy Day Fund," which the Town can use if needed. Each year, the Town publishes its adopted budget on the Town website, including these numbers and information, going back to 2021. They can be reviewed here: www.viennava.gov/budget.

The process to determine the upcoming fiscal year 2026 operating budget has already begun. Here's a glimpse of the timeline, including the expected adoption date:



The Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) is focused on the maintenance and improvement of infrastructure – roads, water systems, parks, and other property. The CIP is reviewed by Council each year, and the Town Manager may adjust it as needed. The CIP is connected to the bond issue undertaken by the Town every two years. Each CIP bond issue amount varies depending on the needs of the Town and how much the Town's meals taxes can support. Vienna receives the highest bond rating – AAA – due to the Town's strong record of fiscal management. For example, in 2020, the Town went out for a \$37.6M Bond, for uses including building the new Police Station. In 2022, the Town went out for a \$12.0M Bond to help pay for street and sidewalk repairs along with water and sewer and infrastructure projects. As we work through the operating budget process, the Council is also working on approving the 2025 and 2026 Capital Improvement Plans. Here's a quick glance at that projected timeline:

Hypothermia Prevention Program

s we continue to experience dangerously cold temperatures this winter season, it's important to remember those who might be exposed to the harsh winter elements. If you or someone you know needs shelter from the cold, Fairfax County's Hypothermia Prevention Program can help.

For 20 years, the Hypothermia Prevention Program has helped ensure that no one sleeps outside during the winter months, providing any adult in need with warm shelter, food, and other basic needs and services every year from Dec. 31-March 31.



Shelters and faith community sites are available across Fairfax County. The closest location for Vienna residents is the Embry Rucker Community Shelter, located at 11975 Bowman Towne Dr., in Reston (open 24/7) or the North County Human Services Center, located at 1850 Cameron Glen Dr., in Reston (open 5-7 p.m.).

Less is More

his season, tackle winter weather the environmentally friendly way. When applying salt—think less is more! A little salt goes a long way in deicing driveways, sidewalks and other surfaces to ensure pedestrian and motorist safety. Too much salt can cause vehicle corrosion, damage sidewalks and roads over time, and contaminate streams (impacting fish and human drinking water sources). One coffee mug of salt can treat a 20-foot driveway. Scatter it so there is plenty of space between grains. Another tip: remove snow in stages as it falls and before it turns to ice. This way, you'll be able to use less deicer, and it will be more effective on a slick surface!

Take the Guesswork out of Recycling

ecycling properly helps reduce our waste, conserve energy, and save money. But sometimes, trying to remember what is and isn't recyclable can be frustrating. Luckily, the Town of Vienna has quick-reference guide stickers and magnets available to place on your fridge or recycling bin like the one pictured here. And, when you recycle, keep these things in mind:

- Recycle paper, cardboard, cans, plastic bottles, jugs, and tubs.
- Keep recycling clean and dry.
- Do not recycle plastic bags and do not bag recyclables.

The Dangers of Allowing Someone to Move into Your Home and the Legal Implications in Virginia

any individuals make the decision to allow a family member, friend, or even a stranger, to move into their home. Whether it's for financial assistance or to help someone in need, this seemingly harmless decision can have serious legal implications, particularly in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

As a police officer, I've seen firsthand the complications that arise when someone moves into your home and establishes residency. This can happen even if the person is not paying rent, or if they stop paying rent altogether. Once a person has lived in your home for a certain period of time and can prove they reside there, they may acquire legal rights. This includes protections against being asked to leave. In Virginia, this means that if the person refuses to leave, you, the homeowner, must follow the legal eviction process to remove them from your property.

This eviction process involves giving proper notice to the tenant, filing a complaint with the court, and attending a court hearing. If you ask the person to leave without following these legal steps, you could face legal repercussions.

Furthermore, living together can sometimes lead to conflicts that escalate into uncomfortable or even dangerous situations. In such cases, law enforcement may become involved, further complicating the matter.

Before allowing someone to move into your home, it's important to understand both the legal and personal risks involved. Setting clear boundaries from the start and knowing the eviction process can help prevent future conflict and protect your peace of mind.


