

Park Street Hearing August 27

For some two years now, the Town's Public Works Department has been working with the Virginia Department of Transportation to develop plans for the reconstruction of Park Street, S.E., from Maple Avenue to Fardale

On Monday, August 27, beginning at 7:30 p.m., a public hearing will be held at the Vienna Community Center for the purpose of receiving public opinion on the construction plans. The hearing will be preceded by a plan review session from 4 to 7 p.m. to allow the public to review the plans with VDOT representatives and ask questions about the project.

The Park Street reconstruction project will cost approximately \$2.1 million, of which the Town of Vienna will be responsible for 2% or \$46,280. Construction should begin in late 1991.

The project will consist of improvements along both sides of the street, which will upgrade it to an urban standard residential street consisting of a 26- to 29-foot typical pavement width in the residential section and a 36-foot pavement width in the commercial area. The improvements will also include curb and gutter, new driveway entrances on both sides of the street, and sidewalks on the west side of the street. In addition, the storm drainage improvements will put pipes underground and connect them to the system near the Community Center, thus eliminating the deep ditches along Park Street.

Some of the benefits of the project are:

- Pedestrian traffic, especially children attending Cunningham Park School, will have adequate sidewalks and will be protected by the concrete curb.

- Corner radii will be increased from 20 to 30 feet at all intersections, providing for safer

- The upgraded road geometry will improve the response time for fire trucks and other emergency vehicles.

- The overall appearance of the street will improve as a result of the addition of curb and gutter, sidewalks and new driveway entrances.

- Traffic flow at the intersection of Park and Maple will be enhanced with the modification of the traffic signal at this location. The increased width at the intersection will allow for a left-turn lane to reduce congestion.

- Ramps for the handicapped will be installed at all corners of the project.

TOWN COUNCIL ACTION

JUNE 4, 1990

- Following a public hearing, set water rates for fiscal year 1990-91 at \$1.81 per 1,000 gallons for town residents and \$2.19 for out-of-town customers. Set the sewer rate at \$2.27 for all customers.
- Following a public hearing, adopted vehicle license taxes of \$20 for vehicles weighing less than 4,000 pounds, \$25 for vehicles over 4,000 pounds, and \$10.50 for motorcycles, effective July 1.
- Following a public hearing, adopted a cigarette tax of 15 cents per pack, effective July 1.
- Adopted the Town budget for FY 1990-91, and set the real estate tax rate at 28 cents per \$100 assessed valuation.
- Approved the assessment of an additional \$2 for each Town court case, funds to be used for courtroom maintenance.
- Adopted amendments to erosion and siltation control regulations.

JUNE 18, 1990

- Following a public hearing, directed that the 200 and 300 blocks of Nutley Street, N.W., be posted "No Parking from 7:00 A.M. to 10:00 A.M. Monday through Friday, Holidays Excepted," except on the side of the street in front of Louise Archer School where parking will be restricted between 7 and 9 a.m.
- Resolved support for ViVa! Vienna!, Inc., for continuation of the annual town festival.
- Denied a request to purchase Town-owned property near Abbotsford and Prelude Drives.
- Awarded the contract for architectural services for the proposed police facility to Peck, Peck & Associates, Inc.
- Approved the installation of a four-way stop at Hillcrest and Yeonas Drives, S.W.
- Approved a five-year renewal of the agreement for use of the Vienna railroad station by the Northern Virginia Model Railroaders.

- Denied a request for a right-turn lane from Church Street onto Beulah Road, N.E.
- Approved an agreement with Fairfax County on the Church Street revitalization project, subject to an amendment that on receipt of the necessary engineering feasibility studies, the Town and County will review the project and discuss available economic and physical alternatives.
- Adopted an amendment to the motor vehicle code concerning drunk driving, in accordance with new State law.
- Awarded a contract for water line cleaning and relining to Spinello Construction Co. of Morristown, N.J., at a bid price of \$143,270.
- Referred to the Transportation Safety Commission the matter of traffic management at streets that intersect with Nutley Street, S.W., from Marshall to Courthouse Roads.
- Reappointed the following Town officials for FY 1990-91: Town Attorney John F. Gionfriddo; Town Treasurer Philip R. Grant; Town Clerk Carol A. Orndorff; and Town Manager John H. Schoeberlein.

JUNE 25, 1990

- Held an executive session to discuss the ongoing litigation Tamburello v. Town of Vienna, to interview an applicant for appointment to the Board of Architectural Review, and to discuss upcoming vacancies on Town boards and commissions.

Tysons Corner History Book

Another book on local history has been written by Connie and Mayo Stuntz, authors of This Was Vienna, Virginia, Facts and Photos. The new book, This Was Tysons Corner, Virginia, Facts and Photos, is a detailed history of the Tysons area from 18th century grants and the first Fairfax County Courthouse area through 1989.

The story of life at Tysons Corner is told through Civil War claims testimony, the 1868-1881 diaries of a man who owned three corners of Tyson's Crossroads, reminiscences of the early 1920's by a resident of Freedom Hill Farm, plats depicting the progression of roads, and 18 aerial photographs.

This Was Tysons Corner, a 190-page hardback book with 198 illustrations, is available for \$29.95 plus \$1.35 sales tax weekdays at Town Hall; weekend afternoons at the Freeman House; at the Stuntz home, 2596 Chain Bridge Rd. (938-8176); and at Waldenbooks and Brentanos at Tysons I.

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BUSINESS PERSON AND CITIZEN OF THE YEAR AWARDS

The Greater Vienna Chamber of Commerce wishes to enlist your help in selecting nominees for the Business Person and Citizen of the Year awards.

The awards program seeks to recognize those persons who make a distinctive contribution to improving the quality of life or the general good of members of our community.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. The nominees must contribute above and beyond normal performance of business activity.
- 2. Efforts must be sustained over a long period of time and/or result from an outstanding one time contribution in the last 13 months (July 1989 August 1990).
- 3. Eligible recipients must have a business or residential address within the Greater Vienna area.
- 4. The "Business Person of the Year" must be nominated from the business community and the qualifying contribution must be the result of efforts not directly related to his or her normal business activity. Officers and Members of the Board of Directors of the Greater Vienna Chamber of Commerce will not be eligible.
- 5. The "Citizen of the Year" must be nominated from the non-business community. Eligibility will be dependent upon the nominee's significant contribution to the betterment of the community.

The deadline for receipt of nominations will be September 14, 1990.

Persons receiving awards will be honored at a special luncheon in October.

SUBMISSION OF NOMINATIONS

To expedite the submission of nominations, the following guidelines are offered to nominators:

- 1. Submit a concise basic statement (not more than three pages in length) which contains the following information regarding the nominee:
 - ♦ Identification of the nominee
 - ♦ A description of the achievement as such, and a description of the nominee's role, extent of responsibility and extent to which the achievement exceeds normal performance or business activity or has contributed significantly to the betterment of the community
 - ♦ Citations of tangible evidence demonstrating the stature of the achievement
 - ♦ Identification of the nominator
- 2. To the extent feasible, supplement the basic nomination statement with pertinent exhibits, such as documents, testimonials, news stories, or other similar supporting evidence.
- 3. If the nominator wishes to have any of the supporting material returned when it has served its purpose, this should be clearly specified.
- 4. Note the cover sheet form on the reverse side of this page. It is designed to provide quick, positive identification of each nomination. Use the reverse side as the cover page for your nomination.

Historic Maps in August Centennial Display

Historic maps and aerial photographs of Vienna and the surrounding area will be on display at Patrick Henry Library during the month of August as part of Vienna's Centennial celebration.

The library's main display case will hold a collection of maps and sketches of the area dating from the 19th and 20th centuries. These include a reproduction of the G.M. Hopkins map showing Vienna in 1878 and a multicolored layout of the Ayr Hill Subdivision laid out around the turn of the century, as well as street plans for the Singlehurst and Onondio Subdivisions.

Aerial photographs of the Vienna-Tysons area, taken in 1937, 1962 and 1988, will be on display in the meeting room. The photos will be labeled with sites, crossroads and landmarks of interest.

VIENNA/TYSONS AERIAL PHOTOS

Aerial photographs depict the physical and cultural landscape of an area at a given time. In the 20th century, many professions - mapmakers, geologists, agronomists, ecologists, social historians and countless others - have come to depend heavily on this tool for uses ranging from settlement of property disputes to siting of toxic waste dumps to genealogical investigation.

The federal government began systematic acquisition of aerial photography in the 1930's. The original purpose was largely one of crop management, explaining why little urban coverage is found in these early years (Vienna was photographed before New York City).

This month's display at Patrick Henry Library includes the first aerial photo of Northern Virginia, taken in 1937 from around 13,000 feet, resulting in a scale of 1 x 20,000. These pre-World War II photos of the adjoining Vienna and Tysons quadrants depict a pastoral, rural landscape, a view little different from that which would have appeared almost 50 years earlier at the time of Vienna's 1890 incor-

poration.

The 1962 photographs in the exhibit are roughly of the same quadrants and at the same scale. Vienna's first wave of suburbanization is clearly evident. The Tysons Corner area remains rural but on the verge of its explosive development, as shown by Beltway construction and ground clearing for Tysons I. Finally, for contrast, the 1988 photograph shows the Vienna/Tysons area as it appears today. It was shot at double the scale of the earlier versions.

Sites and landmarks of interest are indicated on the 1937 and 1962 photos. To the extent possible, the numbers on the two photos correspond to the same sites, to aid as points of reference and to show

some land use changes over this 25year period.

CENTENNIAL TREES


