### Community Input Sought for Proposed FY2026 Town Budget

t's budget season in the Town of Vienna and community members are invited to weigh in on the proposed fiscal year 2026 balanced budget, which holds the real estate tax rate unchanged at \$0.1950 per \$100 of assessed value. The proposed \$55.5 million plan also funds pay increases for eligible employees, addresses inflationary increases in operating costs and supports three parks and recreation needs identified as priorities in a December 2024 Town Council work session.

"This proposed balanced budget is lean compared to previous budgets, with a modest 3.2 percent increase over the current year's budget to manage inflationary pressures," said Town Manager Mercury Payton. "While proposed budgets in some of our neighboring jurisdictions call for an increase in property taxes to cover their operating expenses, our proposed budget demonstrates our commitment to provide services that we can with the revenue that we have."

The Town Council began deliberating the Town Manager's proposed budget during two budget work sessions on Saturday,

March 15 and Monday, March 17. The proposed budget is available for review online: www.viennava.gov/budget.

### Money Well Spent

### How the Town of Vienna Spent its Share of ARPA Funding

t's been four years since the United States Congress passed The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to provide COVID-19 pandemic-related financial relief to state and local governments. It was an economic shot in the arm that gave jurisdictions the ability to pay essential workers, continue government services, and make necessary capital investments in water, sewer, and/or broadband infrastructure.

Today, the Town of Vienna's overall infrastructure is stronger, thanks to the \$17 million lifeline from the federal government. The Public Works Department received the bulk of the ARPA funds and spent more than \$10 million to improve the Town's water and sewer infrastructure, street and sidewalk network, building security and accessibility.

"The most visible accomplishments that residents will notice are the improvements to our sidewalks and streets," said Vienna Public Works Director Brad Baer. "Many of the streets that were in poor condition at the start of the pandemic have been restored to good condition, and thanks to ARPA funds, we were able to address these needs more quickly than we would through traditional funding sources."

The balance of Vienna's ARPA funds paid for needs in five additional Town service areas:

**Information Technology:** to address critical hardware, security and software needs to better serve residents and to better defend against cybersecurity threats.

**Vienna Police:** to purchase and implement a body-worn camera program, update dispatch services, critical in-car radio and video systems, and a property room barcoding system, among other projects.

**Economic Development:** to support tourism initiatives and support





local businesses hard hit by the impact of the pandemic.

**Parks and Recreation:** to fund improvements to the Town Green, the Vienna Community Center and the Nutley Property Yard.

**Finance Department:** to pay for customer-facing system enhancements and feasibility studies for improvements to Vienna Town Hall.

"It was money well spent, and very much appreciated," said Town of Vienna Finance Director Steven Barlow. "Not all of the ARPA-funded improvements are visible to the community, but all have and will have a positive impact on the quality of life for all residents for generations to come."

Some projects are still underway and are expected to be completed by the end of 2026. In addition, the Town Council also has nearly \$1 million of interest generated by the Town's ARPA funding, which can be allocated to general projects or initiatives.

### Patrick Henry Library Prepares for Moving Day

new chapter in local history is about to begin as Patrick Henry Library prepares to move to a temporary library location at Cedar Park Shopping Center. Shelves at the current location on Maple Avenue are being cleared to prepare for moving and storage, and meeting room reservations are no longer being accepted at the current location.

The Patrick Henry Temporary Library is expected to open in the Cedar Park Shopping Center this spring or early summer. The 2,800 square-foot location will offer a small browsing selection, public Wi-Fi, Chromebooks for onsite use, and limited programming such as story time for young patrons. Library users will also be able to pick up holds or return books at the temporary location.

The future Vienna-Carter Library will replace the existing Patrick Henry Library with an expansive, one-story, state-of-the-art facility and a four-level parking structure on the existing site located at 101 Maple Ave., Vienna. It will also feature an outdoor reading and gathering space and a flexible community space that will be open during and after regular business hours. The new Vienna-Carter library is expected to open in the summer of 2027.





### Gentle Reminder: Time to Tidy the Lawn

#### It's the Law

pring is here, and now is the time to plan for your yard's maintenance. Public health and safety risks can be created by overgrown grass, weeds, and other foreign growth, which is why the Town code requires property owners to maintain their yards.



Property owners should

mow their grass and prune all plantings; and remove trash, litter, garbage and debris. By law, grass and weeds should be no taller than six inches in height within 100 feet of any street or adjacent property line.

Property owners must also prevent vegetation on their lots from growing into public streets or sidewalks. This ensures safe, unobstructed passage for pedestrians.

### Saying "No" to the Con-sino - the Movement Continues

he Vienna Town Council made opposition to a casino in Tysons its number one priority for the 2025 Commonwealth legislative session. For the second year in a row, the "no-casino" coalition prevailed. While the legislation that would have allowed for a casino referendum in Fairfax County passed the Senate, it died in the House of Delegates. We are grateful for our representatives in Richmond, Delegate Holly Siebold and Senator Sadam Salim, for their active opposition to this measure. And we are also thankful for the hard work by civic organizations in Tysons, McLean, Reston, and Vienna for the enormous efforts they

made to defeat this bill. In the end, it took all of us working together to stop this piece of legislation.

But the fight is not over. The proponents of this bill have fought for the measure in the past three sessions, and they have vowed to bring it back next year. There is a lot of money at stake. And the proponents' promises of immense, painless tax revenue is hard to turn down.

Nevertheless, the Council remains adamantly opposed to a casino in Tysons – or anywhere else in Fairfax County. We believe that the tax and economic benefits have been greatly exaggerated, and the proponents' estimates ignore negative impacts on property values, traffic and problem gambling.

We are not sitting idle until the next session. To be successful once again, we need your help. If you have an interest in joining the "con" casino movement, please contact me. We need to keep the "con" casino movement alive.





### **Keeping Your Drinking Water Safe**



f you've noticed a chlorine taste in your drinking water lately, there's no cause for concern. Each spring, the Town's water treatment process switches from combined chlorine to free chlorine to clean out the water distribution system, and that process started on March 24.

"You may notice a chlorine taste or odor in your drinking water during the time that free chlorine is used."

said Emily Goodman, Town of Vienna Water and Sewer Superintendent, "but the water is still absolutely safe to drink."

Goodman says if you do notice a change, you can reduce the chlorine taste or smell by running the cold tap for 2-5 minutes, refrigerating cold tap water in an open container, or using a water filter. All of these strategies will help improve taste during the water treatment period.

Public works crews also flush water mains this time of year to ensure the Town's 900+ fire hydrants operate properly. The work takes place from 9 p.m. until 7 a.m. and will continue through May 5.

### **Drug Take Back Day Makes Medication Disposal Easy and Safe**

o you have unwanted or expired medications in your medicine cabinet? Don't throw them in the trash! Instead, drop them off at the Vienna Police Department during National Drug Take Back Day. The semi-annual event is held as a public service to provide Vienna residents with an opportunity to get rid of unwanted medications safely and anonymously.



This year's spring Drug Take Back Day will be held on Saturday, April 26 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the police department located at 215 Center St. S, Vienna, Va. Medications may be dropped off in their original containers, but personal or identifying information should be removed from prescription bottles. Liquid products should be sealed in their original container to prevent leakage. Vape pens and other e-cigarette devices are also accepted, but only if batteries have been removed. Not accepted are intravenous solutions, injectables, and syringes due to associated hazards, except for EpiPens.

More than 170 lbs. of unused or expired medications were collected during the fall Drug Take Back Day event in October 2024. Vienna Drug Take Back Day is being conducted in partnership with the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration and the Virginia State Police. ### Safely Dispose of Unwanted Firearms

n my 17-year career with the Vienna Police Department, I've received numerous inquiries from residents asking how to properly dispose of an unwanted, found, inherited or nonfunctional firearm. If you're a Town of Vienna resident, we've got you covered!

The Town of Vienna Police Department will gladly accept firearms you no longer wish to keep and ensure they are properly and safely destroyed, all at no cost to you. Here's what you need to do:

- **Step 1:** Make sure your firearm is unloaded. If you also have ammunition you'd like to get rid of, we can handle that too!
- **Step 2:** Don't try to unload the firearm yourself if you're unsure. Bring the firearm directly to the Vienna Police Department.
- Step 3: Once you arrive and park outside the police department, stay in your vehicle, and call our police dispatcher at 703-255-6366. An officer will meet you outside to ensure the firearm is safely handled.
- **Step 4:** Bring your ID with a Town of Vienna address and your phone number. The officer will ask you a few quick questions about how you came to have the firearm, write a short report, and safely package the firearm for destruction.

**Important Safety Reminder:** Never bring a firearm, loaded or unloaded, inside the station. All unwanted firearm deliveries take place outside in the parking lot.

It's as easy as that! Together, we can help keep our community safe by ensuring unwanted firearms are disposed of properly and responsibly.

Just download the app on your Android or Apple device, register, and click "Report an Issue." The platform enables users to upload a supporting photo and features an interactive map that pinpoints the location of each report. Those who report a problem can expect email responses or may check the status of their concern via the app. You can also access Vienna

Connect from a computer via the Town website. Just log on to www.viennava. gov, click on the "report a problem" button on the homepage and start reporting.
