Parade Ushers in Liberty Amendments Month Events

t was all smiles on Saturday, June 14 as the Town of Vienna's first-ever Liberty Amendments Month Parade down Maple Avenue ushered in the month-long event to celebrate the American way of life. The parade led to this year's Juneteenth festival at First Baptist Church on Orchard Street, NW, in Vienna, featuring family-friendly activities and voter registration.

Liberty Amendments Month comprises multiple events that celebrate the Constitutional Amendments that give all U.S. citizens a say in how they are governed, regardless of their culture or station in life. The month commemorates the passage of the 13th, 14th, 15th and 19th Amendments, which granted full rights to citizens who were previously excluded from the U.S. Constitution. The Town of Vienna initiated the celebration in 2021 after Juneteenth was declared a state holiday.

The celebration continues this month with a slate of activities that everyone is sure to enjoy.

All Liberty Amendments (13th, 14th, 15th and 19th) are at the heart of Vienna's Independence Day celebration, which takes place from 6-10 p.m. on Wednesday, July 2, at Yeonas Park. The patriotic event includes live music, and of course the main event – a spectacular fireworks display beginning at 9:30 p.m.

On the traditional Independence Day, July 4 at 11 a.m., community members are invited to take part in an inspiring reading of our nation's foundational documents at the Vienna Community Center. Community members will read portions of the Fairfax Resolves, Virginia Declaration of Rights, the Declaration of Independence, Bill of Rights, Emancipation Proclamation, and each of the Liberty Amendments in a

round-robin style to reflect on the legal framework penned by our Founding Fathers, which continue to support the nation nearly 250 years after its birth.

Several other historical presentations, activities and events for people of all ages will take place throughout Liberty Amendments month, including the Vienna Business Association (VBA) Mixer and Empowering Women Panel, the VA250 Mobile Museum Exhibit, a summer concert and the Liberty Amendments Month Children's Readers Theatre. Back to the Future - Repurposing a Historic Landmark

ast month's Vienna Voice reported that the Town is teaming up with NOVA Parks to explore creating a regional visitor center along the W&OD Trail and mentioned that the proposal allows the Town to explore purchasing "a

historic bank building across the street on Dominion Road for future Town use." I'd like to tell you more about that building because, to me, it's the most exciting historic preservation opportunity to come along in years.

Not only is this building historic, it is Vienna's very first bank! According to Connie and Mayo Stuntz' enlightening book "This Was Vienna, Virginia," a group of local businessmen organized as the Vienna National Bank in 1920, constructed this handsome brick building, and moved in three years later. An article in the July 27, 1923, edition of the Fairfax Herald assured prospective depositors that "[t]he vault will be modern and will be as burglar proof as it is possible to make a vault."

In 1929, the company transformed into the Vienna Trust Company, which is how some long-time Vienna residents remember it. For years it was the only bank in the Vienna area, surviving the Wall Street Crash and the Great Depression. It was one of only four banks in Fairfax County to be allowed to reopen after the so-called Bank Holiday of 1933 to allow depositors to withdraw limited sums for absolutely necessary expenses, and for businesses to draw money to meet payrolls.

An Aug. 14, 1936, Fairfax Herald reported that the bank extended an emergency loan of \$500 to the Town of Vienna



"to tide the town over until taxes begin to come into the town treasury in November".

Although the building was last occupied as a financial institution years ago, it is largely unchanged from how it looked in the above 1940s photo (albeit in need of some vigorous topiary sculpting!). The Town now has the right to study whether it can be restored to a condition suitable for public use before deciding whether to buy it. If the study results are favorable, I look forward to hearing your ideas for the building's use through multiple engagement opportunities, or you can always email the full Council at **council@viennava.gov**.

ienna, June 26, 1920. The Vienna National Bank opens for business in this frame building, which had been occupied by Bouton & Milburn, an insurance firm. It was located on Church Street behind the electric railway station operated by the Washington-Virginia Railway. Bank business so rapidly increased, bank trustees started looking for a new home just two years after opening. The new bank building, which is still in existence today, opened to the public on Jan. 12, 1924, at the corner of Church Street and Dominion Road, NE, and is now occupied by Posh!, Inc. **V**

Crosswalk and Bicycle Safety – Let's Keep Vienna Moving Safely

armer weather always leads to an increase in motor vehicle, bicycle, and pedestrian traffic as people venture outdoors. It also increases the potential for serious accidents when people get in a hurry and fail to obey traffic signal, crosswalk and bicycle laws. Whether you're walking, biking, or driving, safety is a shared responsibility.

Crosswalks, whether marked or unmarked, are legally protected zones where pedestrians have the right of way. However, pedestrians must enter crosswalks with caution and ensure approaching vehicles have time to yield. Flashing or blinking crosswalk signals are not suggestions; they are mandatory indicators for vehicles to stop until pedestrians in the crosswalk are safely across. Failure to yield can result in serious consequences, both legal and tragic.

Unmarked crosswalks at intersections are just as enforceable, even if the lines aren't painted. Everyone should be especially mindful around schools, parks, and other hightraffic areas.

Bicycle safety is a growing focus in Vienna as people pedal for leisure or to work. Virginia law requires cyclists to obey the same traffic signs, signals and yielding rules as motor vehicle drivers. Failing to do so can lead to the same legal consequences as motor vehicle drivers who violate traffic safety laws.


Here are key Vienna biking laws to remember:

- **Helmets** are required for riders younger than 15 and recommended for everyone.
- Lights and reflectors are required when riding at night.
- Bells or horns must be audible from at least 100 feet.
- **Sidewalk riding** is allowed for children younger than 15 and for all cyclists where the road is unsafe, but cyclists must yield to pedestrians.
- **No earbuds** in both ears while riding. It is illegal and dangerous.

Let's work together to keep Vienna safe and enjoyable for everyone. Whether you're on foot, on two wheels, or behind the wheel, your choices matter.
