"Grasscycling" Encouraged

Reminder: Grass Clippings Collected On First Pickup Day Each Week 🖘

The Vienna Public Works Department reminds residents that grass clippings are collected on the first pickup day each week.

Grass is collected in addition to household trash on the first pickup day of the week, with recyclable materials (newspapers, glass, plastic, metal, and yard debris other than grass) collected on the second pickup day.

Grass clippings should be separated from household trash and placed in plastic bags for pickup. Grass and trash are picked up on Mondays for residents on the Monday/Thursday collection route, Tuesdays for residents on the Tuesday/Friday route, and Wednesdays for residents on the Wednesday/Saturday route.

To reduce disposal fees and save tax dollars, citizens are encouraged to recycle grass clippings rather than bag them for pickup. Use a mulching blade on your lawn mower and leave grass clippings on the lawn, or use them for mulch or compost. Public Hearing On FY 94 Budget

At its May 10 meeting, the Town Council will hold a public hearing on the proposed Town budget for fiscal year 1993-94. The meeting will begin at 8 p.m. in the Council Chamber at Town Hall.

At the hearing, citizens will have the opportunity to comment on the proposed budget and ask any questions about the appropriation of Town funds for the fiscal year beginning July 1.

Copies of the proposed budget are available for review in the Human Resources Office at Town Hall and at Patrick Henry Library. Copies may also be purchased from the Town at a cost of \$8.49 each.

The proposed general fund budget of \$9,987,736 is based on a real estate tax rate of 32¢ per \$100 of assessed valuation, an increase of 2¢ over the current rate, or about \$20 per year for the average homeowner. This increase was proposed by the Town Manager to offset an estimated decline in the overall assessed valuation of properties on the tax roll, and the proposed tax

Items such as a responsive Police Department, prompt and efficient snow removal, local control over issues such as zoning, etc., have not been assigned a dollar value; however, even with a \$250,000 assessed value, a town resident pays only \$88.76 more per year (\$7.40 per month) than a county resident. At a \$175,000 assessment, the town resident pays \$70.21 less per year (\$5.85 per month).

rate may change when an official assessment report is received from Fairfax County.

The proposed water and sewer fund budget is \$3,298,865. An increase of 13¢ per 1,000 gallons in the water rate and an increase of 1¢ per 1,000 gallons in the sewer rate have been proposed to offset debt service requirements, an increase in the cost of purchasing water, and a new waterworks licensing fee required by the Commonwealth. The total in-town rate would increase from \$4.27 to \$4.41 per 1,000 gallons, or about \$14 per year for the average customer.

If Council considers it necessary, a final budget work session to discuss comments made at the public hearing will be held at 7:30 p.m. Monday, May 24. Adoption of the budget is scheduled for the June 7 Council meeting.

Keep Plantings Trimmed for Safety

Now that the April showers have ended and the May flowers are beginning to bloom, your Planning and Zoning Department and Public Works Department ask every resident to make sure that bushes and other plantings are trimmed so that they do not obstruct someone's vision or impede someone's path on a sidewalk or right-of-way.

The Town restricts the height of plantings, fences and shrubbery to three feet above the curb level within 25 feet of an intersection. Keeping this foliage trimmed makes it easier to see

approaching vehicles. If you have questions or complaints about obstruction of vision at intersections, call the Planning and Zoning Department at 255-6341.

The Town also prohibits vegetation from encroaching on a sidewalk or right-of-way. If you have questions or complaints about obstruction of sidewalks and rights-of-way, call the Public Works Department at 255-6382.

Every resident's effort to keep plantings trimmed will help make Vienna a safer and more attractive community.
