## **Order Your Free Mulch Delivery Now**

The Public Works Department will deliver ground leaf mulch and ground wood mulch to town residents free of charge beginning in mid-January. The minimum order for each type of mulch is a dump truck load.

Orders will be taken from December 1 through February 29. To place your order and for more information. call the Public Works Department at 255-6382.

By grinding leaves and brush into recyclable mulch, the Town saves thousands of dollars in landfill fees each year while providing residents with tons of free leaf and wood mulch.

Residents may pick up mulch themselves in any amount. The mulch is stored on Town owned property off Beulah Road near Glyndon Park. Look for the sign, "Free Leaf Mulch & Wood Mulch."

## **Model BPOL Ordinance Adoption** On December 4 Council Agenda

At its December 4 meeting, the Town Council will consider adoption of a proposed model ordinance concerning the business, professional and occupational license (BPOL) tax. The meeting will begin at 8 p.m. in the Council Chamber at Town Hall.

The model ordinance was the subject of a public hearing on November 6, and based on further discussion at a subsequent work session, Council will consider adopting the ordinance as presented at the public hearing with the following changes:

- 1. Changing the deadline for filing BPOL returns from the current March 1 to
- 2. Establishing a gross receipts threshold of \$50,000 before the tax goes into effect. Please note that this does not mean an exemption of \$50,000 for all businesses, but applies only to those businesses with annual gross receipts of \$50,000 or less, which would pay only the minimum license fee of \$30 per year.

A question was raised at the public hearing concerning application of the BPOL tax to independent insurance agents (agents who write policies for a number of companies). These agents are required to pay the tax, although State law exempts exclusive agents working for only one company.

The model BPOL ordinance was developed by the Virginia Municipal League (VML) and the Virginia Association of Counties (VACO) to address various problems relating to the lack of uniformity in the administration of the BPOL tax, which has long been criticized by the business community. Each local jurisdiction is being encouraged by VML and VACO to adopt the model ordinance in order to make the BPOL tax more uniform across the state and lessen its impact on small and new businesses.

## **Town's Snow Plows Ready for Action**

The Town of Vienna is famous for its efficient snow removal. Department of Public Works crews begin sanding and salting operations immediately at the onset of snow and ice. Plowing begins when snow has accumulated two inches or more, with the primary streets listed below receiving top priority:

Maple Avenue John Marshall Drive (Glyndon to Beulah)

Nutley Street Creek Crossing Road
Park Street Cottage Street

Center Street Church Street
Kingslev Road (Park to Nutley) Tapawingo Road (Park to Nutley)

Kingsley Road (Park to Nutley)

Courthouse Road

Locust Street

Tapawingo Road (Park Follin Lane
Branch Road

Locust StreetBranch RoadLawyers RoadBeulah RoadMalcolm RoadCherry StreetOld Courthouse RoadElectric Avenue

Once these streets are passable, snowplows can then move into residential subdivisions following established routes. If the primaries require salting/sanding/ plowing again after one pass, this will be done before going to the secondary streets.

Snow emergency routes within the town are marked by signs. No parking is allowed on these main streets during snows so that plows can do a more efficient job. During snow emergencies, vehicles must have chains or tires approved for use in the snow.

Residents who are physically able are requested to clear snow from the sidewalks next to their property for the safety of pedestrians, especially schoolchildren. Residents who are interested in hiring a youngster to shovel snow can call the Department of Parks and Recreation's Odd Job Bank at 255-6360. Youngsters can sign up at the Vienna Community Center for snow shoveling and other odd jobs.

Town businesses that hire snowplows to clear their parking lots are asked to make sure that snow is not piled onto adjoining sidewalks. This creates a serious hazard for pedestrians
