### Real Estate Tax Due

The first installment on 1996 Town of Vienna real estate taxes is due on July 29. If you have not received your bill by July 15, please call the Town's real estate office, 255-6325.

If your Vienna taxes are paid through your mortgage company and you receive the tax bill, please notify your mortgage company immediately so it can make payment by the due date.

If you have sold the property and are not responsible for the tax bill you receive, please notify the real estate office immediately.

### Yard Sale Reminder

Each household in town may hold two garage/yard sales per year. Two advertising signs, no larger than four square feet each, may be displayed on the property where the sale takes place, and two directional signs, no larger than two square feet each, may be placed on other private property with the owner's permission. Signs are not permitted on public property, in the public right-of-way (10 feet from the curb or edge of pavement), or on utility poles. Illegally placed signs will be removed. # TOWN COUNCIL ACTION

All votes are unanimous unless noted otherwise.

## APRIL 15, 1996

- Following a public hearing, approved a request to rezone Carter's Glen, Section 2, located on the southwest corner of Nutley and Roland Streets, and in the 200 block of Moorefield Road, S.W., from RS-16 to RS-10, single-family residential.

- Received public comment on the proposed Town budget for fiscal year 1996-97.

- Conducted a public hearing on a proposed cellular phone tax.

- Granted the Vienna Regional Chamber of Commerce permission to hold its Harvest Festival at the Vienna Community Center September 27-29 in accordance with certain conditions regarding operating hours, location of equipment, etc.

- Awarded the contract for the Vienna Streetscape Project (Church Street restoration) to Avon Corp. at a cost of \$907,106. (Approved 5-1-1, Garvie voting nay and Seeman abstaining. Councilman Seeman stated his abstention was because Council had not been provided final plans for review.)

- Awarded a bid for park trails asphalt overlay and reconstruction to Mt. Vernon Asphalt and Paving, Inc., of Newington in

the base amount of \$15,589.80 with a contingency of \$3,410.20. The problem of tree root damage to the trails is to be investigated.

- Awarded a contract for asphalt repair to Mt. Vernon Asphalt and Paving, Inc., of Newington at a price of \$17.25 per square yard and a total amount not to exceed \$30,000.

- Authorized the installation of cross-hatch markings at the intersections of Maple Avenue and Nutley Street, Lawyers/Courthouse Roads, Center Street, Park Street, Glyndon Street and Beulah Road.

- Authorized the Town Attorney to draft a proposed franchise ordinance providing for a wireless communication system.

## MAY 13, 1996

- Authorized a member of the Planning Commission to attend the Virginia Certified Planning Commissioners' Program.

- Accepted the proposal for the July 4th fireworks display submitted by Pyrotechnics by Schaefer, Inc., of Lancaster, Pa., in the amount of \$7,000.

- Authorized the preparation of a request for proposals for an engineering analysis of the Community Center heating and air conditioning system.

- Voted to take no further action on a proposed cellular phone tax.

- Approved the prequalification applications for the renovation of Town Hall to comply with requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act, and authorized the project to proceed with advertising for bids.

- Awarded the contract for commercial trash service to Rainbow Waste Control in the amount of \$11,411.40.

## MAY 20, 1996

- Adopted a resolution of recognition and appreciation honoring civil rights activist Lillian Blackwell.

- Conducted a public hearing on the proposed Town budget for fiscal year 1996-97.

- Authorized the Town's continued participation in the Community Development Block Grant Program for fiscal years 1997-99 under the same terms and conditions as now apply.

## Council Adopts Town Budget

The Town Council has adopted Vienna's budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1. The budget for all funds totals \$16,502,334, an increase of \$876,989 or about 5.3% over last year. The real estate tax rate remains the same at 30¢ per \$100 of assessed valuation.

An overall increase of 15¢ in the combined water and sewer rate was approved for FY 1996-97. For the average customer (usage of 25,000 gallons per quarter), the rate adjustments will add about \$3.75 to the quarterly bill. The major reason for the increase is that many of the projects funded by the 1996 bond issue are water and sewer system related and, therefore, the water and sewer fund must assume a greater portion of the debt service cost. These projects, which include increasing water pressure, waterline cleaning, and installation of new waterlines, will result in improving the condition of the system infrastructure and thereby prolong its useful life.

## Permit Required to Erect a Fence

The Town of Vienna requires homeowners to obtain a permit before erecting a fence on their property. The fence permit application must be accompanied by a plat of the property showing the location of the proposed fence and a \$5 fee.

**On interior lots,** a fence may be erected to a maximum height of four feet in front of the house and six feet beside and behind the house.

**On corner lots,** a fence may be erected to a maximum height of six feet except in the following locations:

- A fence built within 25 feet of the property line abutting the side street may be no more than four feet high.

- That part of the fence built within 25 feet of the corner may be no more than three feet high.

- If the house behind yours faces the side street, your back fence may be no more than four feet high from the front of your neighbor's house to your property line at the street. (If the two houses are back to back, then your back fence may be six feet high along the entire rear property line.)

All fences must be constructed within the property lines. The posts and supports must face inward toward your house, and the finished side must face outward toward the street or abutting property.

Remember, fence permits are required before construction begins. For more information and assistance, call the Planning and Zoning Department at 255-6341.

## Hazardous Waste

Hazardous materials such as fuel tanks, pressurized tanks, oil-based paint, solvents, insecticides, and florescent light tubes should never be disposed of with regular household trash due to the danger of soil and water contamination.
