MARCH 1996 – At its March 4 meeting, the Town Council will hold a public hearing on a new "Pedestrian Commercial" zoning category proposed for the Church Street business district. The new zone, designated C-1B, was proposed by the Town/Business Liaison Committee to emphasize pedestrian-oriented activities that could be threatened by the development of drive-through businesses such as fast food, banks, dry cleaners and quick oil changes.

MARCH 1986 – Officer Tom Sherwood, a 14-year veteran of the Vienna Police Department, is the first officer to be assigned to the Town's special traffic enforcement unit. The traffic unit was approved by the Town Council in response to numerous citizen complaints about traffic and speeding problems in residential neighborhoods. An additional traffic officer and two motorcycle officers will join the unit by late spring.

MARCH 1976 – The Howard Devron Orchestra will be providing the music at all three locations for the Town of Vienna's Bicentennial Balls on March 6. The balls will begin at 9 p.m. and run until 1 a.m. at Westwood Country Club, the Flame Room at the fire station, and Our Lady of Good Counsel. Tickets are \$17.76 per couple, and Bicentennial theme costume or semi-formal dress will be required.

Gardening Tips for Homeowners

Your Community Enhancement Commission recommends:

- Plant a tree that will shade your house as well as reduce the need for air conditioning.
- Buy smaller plants. Nursery-grown plants can be pricey. Forgo gallon containers and concentrate on economical 2 and 3-inch containers.
- Start from seed. Seeds, of course, provide the least expensive way to grow a garden. You supply the labor and overhead. It takes a few seasons to get the hang of growing from seed, both indoors and out, but eventually you'll start to "think like a seed," gaining a sense of when and where to plant.
- Accept gifts graciously. Gardeners are usually happy to share divisions of day lilies, iris, and other plants. Just beware of any plant they're too happy to be rid of it could be some invasive thug intent on taking over your garden.
- Waste nothing. Pots and six-packs are good for at least several seasons. Never use dirty containers. Composting garden debris and plant scraps creates yummy organic matter for beds and pots.

Business License Renewal Deadline

Town businesses are reminded that March 1 is the deadline for payment of the annual business, professional and occupational license (BPOL) tax. All businesses in the Town of Vienna, including home occupations, must renew their business licenses by March 1.

The amount of the tax is based on gross receipts, and the rate varies according to the type of business. The gross receipts threshold is \$50,000, below which the tax does not apply. Those businesses with total annual gross receipts of \$50,000 or less pay only the minimum license fee of \$30 per year.

Town Green Turning Greener

It could be said that the Wright Building is in the wrong place! The building, constructed around 1935 at the corner of Maple Avenue and Mill Street as the Wright & Hunt dry goods business, is scheduled for demolition in late March to make way for Vienna's new Town Green.

The Town Green will connect Maple Avenue with Church Street, abutting the W&OD Trail and providing a view of the Freeman House, the old railroad station and caboose, and other historic sites. The project design includes a plaza area with fountain, trees and benches; a lawn for play and picnicking; an amphitheater with sloped lawn for concerts and special events; walkways with benches and trees for sitting and relaxation; restroom facilities; an abundance of landscaped areas for visual enjoyment; parking reconfiguration and enhancements; and widening of Mill Street.

A contract for the demolition of the Wright Building and grading of the site was anticipated to be awarded at the February 27 Town Council meeting. Until the building comes down, the Vienna Fire Department has been given permission to hold evacuation exercises inside. With the several floors, varying ceiling heights, abundance of stairs, tight hallways, and many exit doors, the Fire Department will have the opportunity to spend several weeks inside practicing situational life-saving and emergency evacuation skills.

The public will able to view the building coming down. As details are finalized, watch the Town Web site for the demolition schedule. For further information, call the Parks and Recreation Department at 703-255-6360.

Vehicle Decals Available March 15

2006 Town of Vienna motor vehicle decals go on sale Wednesday, March 15, and must be displayed by midnight April 17. Decals may be purchased by mail or in person in the Finance Department at Town Hall. (Military personnel must apply in person.)

Decals cost \$20 for passenger cars and trucks under 4,000 pounds, \$25 for cars and trucks 4,000 pounds and over, and \$10.50 for motorcycles.

Information on pre-printed application forms for 2006 decals was taken from 2005 records; therefore, if your vehicle was not registered in Vienna last year, you will not automatically receive an application form in the mail. Town of Vienna residents do not need to purchase Fairfax County vehicle decals, but they must pay County personal property tax on motor vehicles. For information about personal property tax, call the County Office of Assessments at 703-222-8234 or visit the County Web site, www.fairfaxcounty.gov.

Voter Registration Deadline April 3

Monday, April 3, is the last day to register to vote in the May 2 Town election. You are eligible to register if you are a Vienna resident, at least 18 years old by election day, and a U.S. citizen.

You may register in person in the Fairfax County General Registrar's Office at the County Government Center or by mail. Application forms are available in the Town Clerk's Office at Town Hall, all public libraries and other locations around the county, and at the County Web site, www.fairfaxcounty.gov.

If you are already a registered voter, no additional registration is required for the Town election; however, you should check your voter registration card to be sure it lists your current name and address.

- Conducted a closed session with the Town Attorney to discuss legal matters involving the Town.
- Following a public hearing, affirmed the decision of the Windover Heights Board of Review approving replacement of the house at 123 Lewis St., N.W., with a new house. (Approved 5-1, Cole voting nay, Verinder absent.)

Tax Relief Offered to Senior, Disabled Low-income Homeowners

Both the Town of Vienna and Fairfax County offer real estate tax relief for low-income homeowners who are 65 years old and over, or permanently and totally disabled. To qualify, the following requirements must be met:

- Total household income of \$72,000 or less. This amount excludes \$6,500 of income of relatives, other than the spouse, who reside in the household. Also excluded is \$7,500 of any income received by a disabled homeowner. 100% tax relief is given for total combined income of \$52,000 or less, 50% tax relief between \$52,001 and \$62,000, and 25% tax relief between \$62,001 and \$72,000.
- Total combined assets of no more than \$340,000. This amount excludes the value of the residence, up to one acre of land, and household furnishings.
- Disabled persons applying for the first time must show evidence of disability. In addition to real estate tax relief, Fairfax County provides rental grants and relief from personal property tax for one automobile per household. The Town of Vienna provides all relief recipients one free auto decal.

Applications for 2006 for all programs are due April 1. This date may be extended to December 31 of next year for first-time filers or if hardship conditions exist which, through no fault of the applicant, prohibit applying by April 1.

County Encourages Citizens to Register for Emergency Alert Network

One of the easiest ways to become better prepared for an emergency or severe weather is to sign up for Fairfax County's Community Emergency Alert Network (CEAN), a free service of the County's Office of Emergency Management.

Citizens registered on the CEAN will be provided a personal connection to real-time



updates, instructions on where to go, protective actions that need to be taken and other important information such as National Weather Service watches and warnings.

CEAN alerts may cover personal safety, weather, major accidents involving utilities or roadways, or disaster notification such as a terrorist attack. In addition, residents also may register for any or all of the additional

CEAN alert categories: severe weather 24/7; severe weather 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday; severe traffic disruptions; and County government closings/schedule changes.

The CEAN will be used by County officials to deliver emergency alerts, notifications and updates during a major crisis or emergency. Messages will be delivered to email accounts, cell phones (text messaging costs may apply; check with your service provider), text pagers, satellite phones, and wireless PDAs that are registered on the system.

To register for the Community Emergency Alert Network, visit the Fairfax County Web page, www.fairfaxcounty.gov/cean. For additional information on the CEAN, contact the Office of Emergency Management at 703-324-2362.

Fairfax County offers the CEAN as a public service that will be used in conjunction with other public notification methods, such as the Fairfax County Emergency Information Line (703-817-7771, TTY 711), cable television Channel 16, the Fairfax County Web site, and area news media.

Picnic Shelters at Parks Available for Group Functions

Reservations for the picnic shelters at Meadow Lane and Glyndon Parks will be taken beginning March 6. The fee for Town of Vienna groups is \$25 for a maximum of five hours plus a \$25 key deposit for use of the restrooms. The shelters can accomodate groups of up to 75 people. Yield to Pedestrians

Your Transportation Safety Commission reminds you that the driver of any vehicle must yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian crossing the street at any marked crosswalk, whether at mid-block or at the end of the block, or at any intersection.

Motorists are urged always to be alert to the possible presence of pedestrians, especially when turning right on red, and to yield the right-of-way with courtesy.

Pedestrians must also act responsibly and not disregard approaching traffic. The American Automobile Association offers these safe walking tips:

- Cross only at designated crosswalks and at intersections.
- At signalized crosswalks, cross only on the proper signal.
- Look *all* ways (not just both ways) before crossing.
- Walk facing traffic where there are no sidewalks.
 - · Wear reflective material after dark.
- Always watch for cars even when you have the legal right-of-way.

SAFE DRIVING TIP – Headlights in use on a vehicle not only improve the driver's vision, but also help alert pedestrians and other vehicles to its approach.

Water Mains Flushed in Spring

Each spring the Town of Vienna flushes the water mains in its distribution system in order to maintain a high standard of water quality and to ensure proper and efficient operation of the fire hydrants. The preventive maintenance program begins in early April, and flushing usually occurs between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m.

Water mains are flushed by opening the fire hydrants and allowing the water to flow freely for a short period of time. The flushing cleans out sediment that normally accumulates during the summer and winter, and enables the Town to test and perform routine maintenance on the 800+ fire hydrants within its service area.

Flushing may result in some discoloration and the presence of sediment in the water reaching your home or business. These conditions are not harmful and should be of short duration. The Town appreciates your tolerance of this inconvenience. If you need more information, please call the Water and Sewer Customer Service Office at 703-255-6385.

Tree and Shrub Seedlings for Sale

The Northern Virginia Soil and Water Conservation District (NVSWCD) is conducting its annual tree and shrub seedling sale. Each seedling package costs \$16.95 and contains 14 bare root seedlings of assorted species. This year's selections, "A Harvest of Fruits and Nuts," include American Hazelnut, gray dogwood, black chokeberry, common persimmon, shadblow serviceberry, and Virginia pine. From late summer into fall, these trees and shrubs produce nuts and colorful berries that attract and sustain migrating songbirds and local wildlife.

New for 2006, NVSWCD is offering Virginia creeper seedlings in packages of four for \$4. This groundcover/vine produces berries and turns red in the fall.


