DECEMBER 1996 – The first annual Holiday Stroll will be held December 8. Enjoy music of the season, festive decorations, and liminary lights along the newly renovated Church Street business district.

DECEMBER 1986 – Do you enjoy singing? The new Vienna Choral Society is looking for members and a director. The group hopes to perform at future town celebrations and for community organizations.

DECEMBER 1976 – With the opening of the new Post Office came traffic problems at Lawyers Road and Church Street. An inadequate number of parking spaces and narrow entrances have complicated the flow of traffic for frustrated postal patrons. The current customer parking lot has only 15 spaces for a facility that serves an area of 22.44 square miles with an estimated population of approximately 58,000 people. The Town has suggested several solutions to ease the situation, including providing an additional exit route to the rear of the Post Office.

DECEMBER 1966 – As many regular listeners of WEEL radio already know, a twice-weekly news program covering Town government activities has in recent weeks been broadcast from various points in the Vienna business area. It is an informal interview with members of the Town staff each Tuesday and Thursday, and questions from Vienna residents about their Town government are invited.

Order Mulch Beginning Dec. 1

The Public Works Department will take orders December 1-February 28 for mulch to be delivered free of charge to town residents beginning in mid-January. To place your order, call the "Mulch Line" recording, 703-255-6388, and leave your name, address, daytime phone number, type of mulch desired (wood or leaf) and the number of loads to be delivered. One load is estimated to be about the size of a VW Beetle, or 2-2.5 cubic yards. Half loads are available on request.

Please note the following important conditions:

- All mulch deliveries are based on availability of mulch.
- Mulch deliveries will be placed only in the driveway at the end closest to the house.
- Once mulch is delivered, it becomes the property of the homeowner and the Town will not remove any excess mulch ordered.

Residents may pick up mulch themselves in any amount between the hours of 9:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday (except holidays) from January 2 through March 30. The mulch is stored on Town-owned property off Beulah Road near Glyndon Park. Look for the sign, "Free Leaf Mulch & Wood Mulch."

In Case of Emergency

As a service to town residents, the Vienna Police Department maintains a VOLUNTARY EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION REGISTRY to facilitate prompt and proper contact with next-of-kin or other designated persons in the event of an emergency. See page 7.

The Vienna Police and the Vienna Volunteer Fire Departments jointly sponsor an INCLEMENT WEATHER PROGRAM for residents with special needs such as the elderly, disabled, and those with severe medical problems. In the event of widespread power outages or hazardous road conditions, a telephone check on the welfare of participants will be made. See pages 5 and 6.

Residents currently registered in either one or both of these programs must complete a new form(s), since the files are purged annually.

Real Estate Tax Deadline

The second installment on 2006 Town of Vienna real estate tax bills is due on Tuesday, December 5. Mailed payments must be postmarked on or before that date to avoid penalties. If you have not yet received your bill, please call the real estate office immediately. If your Vienna taxes are paid through your mortgage company and you received the tax bill, please notify your mortgage company immediately so it can make payment by the due date. If you have sold the property and are not responsible for the tax bill you received, please notify the real estate office immediately.

To pay by phone with a credit card, call 1-888-2PAYTAX (1-888-272-9829) and use the Jurisdiction Code 1094 for real estate. Make sure you record the confirmation number given to you at the end of the transaction, as this will serve as your proof of payment.


Brochure Available on Historic Sites

Bikes@ViennaBusiness Community Service Profile



When the Vienna Town/Business Liaison Committee requested nominations for the first Business Community Service Award last January, one of the first to respond was Jim Larson, chairman of CHO (Committee for Helping Others). The business he nominated was Bikes@ Vienna on Church Street, owned by John Brunow.

Larson's nominating letter said, "Over the past several years Bikes@Vienna has been exceptionally supportive of CHO activities. While adult and children's bicycles are donated throughout the year, special efforts are made to provide bicycles for CHO's annual Christmas program. John Brunow has actively encouraged

bike donations from his regular customers and has often provided parts and repair services gratis or at minimal cost before passing the donated bicycles on to CHO."

Brunow and his wife moved to Vienna in 1991. He says they wanted to live in a town with friendly people and a good sense of community, and they found that in Vienna He started Bikes@Vienna in 1998 after careers as a state legislator in Iowa and as a business executive in the insurance industry. Bikes@Vienna is a community-involved business featuring cycling equipment to promote having fun, exercising for good health, preserving the environment, and saving money. The store specializes in folding bikes, recumbent bikes, and tricycles.

Besides working with CHO, Bikes@Vienna helps conduct the Bike Rodeo for the Vienna Police Department, donates gift certificates for school fund-raising auctions, and promotes many biking outings and events. It also supports Bikes for the World, a rapidly growing program that provides used bicycles for people in many poor and undeveloped countries of the world.

The Town of Vienna Police Department and the Vienna Volunteer Fire Department have united to implement an inclement weather program. In the event of severe weather, widespread power outages or hazardous road conditions, a "check on the welfare" telephone call list will be activated and, if needed, a temporary emergency shelter will be opened and kept in operation either until the Fairfax County Disaster Operations Center can open a shelter or until the situation resolves itself.

This program was designed in response to the severe ice storm that struck the town during the winter of 1998-99 and is directed at citizens who have special needs, such as the elderly, the physically challenged and individuals with severe medical conditions. The purpose of the program is twofold: first, in the event of severe weather to provide a point of contact to check on the status of each individual on the list, and second, if needed, to provide a temporary shelter location until the power has been restored, a longer-term shelter is opened or the weather and road conditions improve.

To register for this program, all that is required is that you fill out the form on the following page and return it to the Vienna Police Department, 215 Center St., S., Vienna, VA 22180. RESIDENTS CURRENTLY REGISTERED MUST ALSO COMPLETE A NEW FORM TO REMAIN IN THE PROGRAM SINCE THE FILES ARE PURGED ANNUALLY.
