This Month in History

from the Vienna Newsletter archives

MARCH 1997 – Former Mayor James C. Martinelli died late last month. During his tenure from 1964 to 1970, major improvements were made to the town's streets, water and sewer system, and parks and recreation programs; Vienna celebrated its 75th anniversary of incorporation and undertook efforts to preserve its historic structures; development of the Vienna Technology Park began; and a beautification and community betterment campaign known as "My Kind of Town – Vienna" won a national award.

MARCH 1987 – Attention Metro riders! As of March 23, fares on Metrobus routes to the Vienna and Dunn Loring Metrorail stations were reduced to just 25¢. At the same time, parking fees at the stations were increased from \$1 to \$1.50 (that is, if you can find a parking space).

MARCH 1977 – Real estate assessment notices will look different this year. Fairfax County is shifting its assessment base from 40% of fair market value, the assessment ratio for real estate since 1946, to 100% of market value. The shift will have little or no effect on individual tax bills, however, because the tax rate will automatically be shifted downward at the same time.

MARCH 1967 – The Town has prepared a supply of certificates to be presented to those who make a significant contribution to the "My Kind of Town – Vienna" anti-litter and beautification campaign. Two of them have been presented to Vienna Trust Company and First National Bank of Vienna for furnishing litter bags, which are being distributed as Town vehicle tags are issued.

Business License Renewal Deadline

Town businesses are reminded that March 1 is the deadline for payment of the annual business, professional and occupational license (BPOL) tax. All businesses in the Town of Vienna, including home occupations, must renew their business licenses by March 1.

The amount of the tax is based on gross receipts, and the rate varies according to the type of business. The gross receipts threshold is \$50,000, below which the tax does not apply. Those businesses with total annual gross receipts of \$50,000 or less pay only the minimum license fee of \$30 per year.

License tax forms are available in the Finance Department at Town Hall and online at www.viennava.gov. For more information or assistance in figuring license taxes, call 703-255-6321.

Vienna Parks & Recreation Now Offers Online Registration

The Vienna Department of Parks and Recreation is pleased to offer WebTrac, its new online registration system. WebTrac allows everyone with access to the Internet to browse activity listings; search for activities by type, age range and other criteria; and look up details about any activity such as price, dates and times, location and current enrollment numbers.

WebTrac will also allow those who are already established in the registration database to enroll for most classes and activies, print a transaction history, and reprint old receipts. If you have registered for programs in the past three years, you should have recieved an e-mail or letter with your ID and password. Simply follow the online instructions. If you need to add a new member to your existing household, call Vienna Parks and Recreation at 703-255-6360 for more information and assistance over the phone. If you are a new recreation program participant, fill out the household registration form (located in the online brochure in pdf format) and fax, mail or drop it off at the Vienna Community Center and an ID and password will be created for you.

Vehicle Decals Available March 15

2007 Town of Vienna motor vehicle decals go on sale Thursday, March 15, and must be displayed by midnight April 16. Decals may be purchased by mail or in person in the Finance Department at Town Hall. (Military personnel must apply in person.)

Decals cost \$20 for passenger cars and trucks under 4,000 pounds, \$25 for cars and trucks 4,000 pounds and over, and \$10.50 for motorcycles.

Information on pre-printed application forms for 2007 decals was taken from 2006 records; therefore, if your vehicle was not registered in Vienna last year, you will not automatically receive an application form in the mail. Voter Registration Deadline April 2

Monday, April 2, is the last day to register to vote in the May 1 Town election. You are eligible to register if you are a Vienna resident, at least 18 years old by election day, and a U.S. citizen.

You may register in person in the Fairfax County General Registrar's Office at the County Government Center or by mail. Application forms are available in the Town Clerk's Office at Town Hall, all public libraries and other locations around the county, and at the County Web site, www.fairfaxcounty.gov.

If you are already a registered voter, no additional registration is required for the Town election; however, you should check your voter registration card to be sure it lists your current name and address. To remain a qualified registered voter, you must notify the Registrar's Office of any change in your name or address before the registration books close for the election.

Find Help with New 2-1-1 Web site

A new Web site launched last month contains a publicly accessible and sortable database of 10,000 programs and 4,000 human services organizations in the Washington region.

www.211metrodc.org provides a generalized information and referral database for essential services such as affordable housing, rent assistance, elder care, health resources, and child care. With this new database, residents of the Washington metropolitan area can identify agencies and programs that meet their needs.

This project is the result of a public-private collaboration spearheaded by the Nonprofit Roundtable of Greater Washington, District of Columbia 211 Answers Please, United Way of Central Maryland, and the Northern Virginia Regional Commission, with funding support from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security Urban Areas Security Initiative, IBM Corporation, and the United Way of the National Capital Area.

Northern Virginia is still looking to acquire 2-1-1 telephone coverage dependent on support from private resources and the Virginia General Assembly.

Use Quadrants in All Addresses

When Vienna became a town in 1890, it was laid out in the shape of a perfect square, divided into quadrants by Maple Avenue and Center Street.

Although the town has lost its square shape with the addition of land over the years, the quadrant designation is still a very important part of your Vienna address. Not only does it show that you live within the town's corporate limits, it prevents mistaking an address in one part of town for the same address in another. Residents of Nutley Street, John Marshall Drive, Tapawingo Road, and other streets that extend into two different quadrants can testify to the hassle of lost deliveries and other problems caused by lack of the quadrant designation. It's also helpful to use your ZIP+4 code to indicate your address even more specifically. To find your ZIP+4 code, go to the U.S. Postal Service Web site, http://zip4.usps.com/zip4/welcome.jsp.

In addition, your house number should be displayed so it is visible and distinguishable from the street. Both the size and location of the number are important. It should be large enough and placed so that it can be read from the center of the street going in both directions on the darkest night, in the worst of weather, and not obscured by shadows or hidden by foliage.

Equation for Pedestrians: Awareness = Safety

In 2006 more that a dozen pedestrians were killed in some 300 pedestrian accidents in Fairfax County. Pedestrians need to be especially cautious whenever they enter the roadway. Even when you are in marked or unmarked crosswalks, you must still exercise due care for your own safety, even though drivers are legally required to yield to you. Pedestrians should:

- · Stop at the curb before entering the roadway:
- · Look left, then right, then left again for oncoming vehicles as drivers don't always see pedestrians or may be inattentive;
- · Watch for turning vehicles as motorists may be careless in respecting pedestrian rights;
- · Be aware that drivers of right-turning vehicles usually are looking left as they begin their turn;
- · Make sure that you are seen by the driver, and if not sure, wait for the driver to pass:
 - · Continue to look at approaching vehicles while crossing;
- Make sure that you are seen by drivers in each lane to be crossed before proceeding. (The driver traveling behind a stopped vehicle may change lanes and hit an unexpected pedestrian.);
 - · Wear bright colors or reflective material at night and in the early morning hours;
- Avoid being lulled into a false sense of security at marked crosswalks; the painted lines provide no protection against vehicles.

Trim Plantings for Safety

Residents are reminded to keep bushes, hedges, and other plantings trimmed so that they do not obstruct the vision of motorists or impede pedestrians and bicyclists. The Town Code restricts the height of vegetation to three feet above the curb level within 25 feet of an intersection. Keeping foliage trimmed makes it easier to see approaching vehicles. If you have questions or complaints about obstruction of vision at intersections, call the Planning and Zoning Department at 703-255-6341.

New Public Works Director Named

Town Manager John H. Schoeberlein has announced the permanent appointment of Holly M. Chu as Vienna's Director of Public Works. She had been serving as Acting Director since September.

Chu joined the Town staff as Town Engineer in 2001. She received a Bachelor of Science degree in civil engineering from the University of Maryland and a Master's degree in civil engineering from the University of Hawaii, and she is a licensed professional engineer (P.E.). Her 16 years of engineering experience includes seven years as a civil engineer with the City and County of Honolulu, Hawaii.

Chu officially assumed her new duties on February 1, following the retirement of former Public Works Director Dennis W. King.

Tax Relief Offered to Senior, Disabled Low-income Homeowners

Both the Town of Vienna and Fairfax County offer real estate tax relief for low-income homeowners who are 65 years old and over, or permanently and totally disabled. To qualify, the following requirements must be met:

- Total household income of \$72,000 or less. This amount excludes \$6,500 of income of relatives, other than the spouse, who reside in the household. Also excluded is \$7,500 of any income received by a disabled homeowner. 100% tax relief is given for total combined income of \$52,000 or less, 50% tax relief between \$52,001 and \$62,000, and 25% tax relief between \$62,001 and \$72,000.
- Total combined assets of no more than \$340,000. This amount excludes the value of the residence, up to one acre of land, and household furnishings.
- Disabled persons applying for the first time must show evidence of disability. In addition to real estate tax relief, Fairfax County provides rental grants and relief from personal property tax for one automobile per household. The Town of Vienna provides all relief recipients one free auto decal.

Applications for 2007 for all programs are due April 2. This date may be extended to December 31 of next year for first-time filers or if hardship conditions exist which, through no fault of the applicant, prohibit applying by April 2.

TaxAide Program Open at SunTrust

The AARP TaxAide program is the nation's largest free, volunteer-run tax preparation service, available to low and middle income taxpayers with special attention to those age 60 and older. All volunteers are trained in tax preparation and certified by the IRS. All returns will be e-filed, and you may have your refund sent directly to your bank. Most clients receive their refund deposits within 2 weeks. **You do not have to be retired or a member of AARP to benefit from this free program.**

Until April 16, TaxAide volunteers will be at SunTrust Bank, 515 Maple Ave., E., Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. No appointment is required. For more information, call 1-888-227-7669.

The AARP TaxAide program also provides online tax counseling as a public service. AARP TaxAide volunteers are trained to understand individual federal tax issues, especially the provisions of the tax code that affect older people. Please limit your questions to federal taxes only. Fairfax County Executive Anthony H. Griffin presented his proposed fiscal plan for FY 2008 to the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors on February 26. The presentation will air on the County's cable channel 16 on Friday, March 2, and Monday, March 5, at 9 p.m. The presentation also will air as part of the Board of Supervisors meeting replay on Saturday, March 3, at 10 a.m., and will be available as video-on-demand on the County's Web site, www.fairfaxcounty.gov/cable throughout the month of March.

Public hearings on the FY 2008 fiscal plan have been set for April 9, 10 and 11, at 7 p.m. with the School Board presentation to the Board of Supervisors scheduled on April 10 at 6 p.m. Those wishing to speak at any of the public hearings should contact the Office of the Clerk to the Board at 703-324-3151 to place their names on the speakers list or sign up online at www.fairfaxcounty.gov/gov/bos/speaker_bos.htm.



Water Mains Flushed in Spring

Each spring the Town of Vienna flushes the water mains in its distribution system in order to maintain a high standard of water quality and to ensure proper and efficient operation of the fire hydrants. The preventive maintenance program begins in early April, and flushing usually occurs between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m.

Water mains are flushed by opening the fire hydrants and allowing the water to flow freely for a short period of time. The flushing cleans out sediment that normally accumulates during the summer and winter, and enables the Town to test and perform routine maintenance on the 800+ fire hydrants within its service area.

Flushing may result in some discoloration and the presence of sediment in the water reaching your home or business. These conditions are not harmful and should be of short duration.
