NOVEMBER 1997 – The Town of Vienna's Church Street revitalization project has been selected by the Community Appearance Alliance of Northern Virginia as a winner of its 1997 award for "visually enhancing the built environment." The awards recognize projects in public spaces, landscapes, streetscapes, and buildings. The Church Street project included the construction of brick sidewalks and crosswalks, installation of period street lamps and benches, and overhead utility lines consolidated on one side of the street.

NOVEMBER 1987 – The Town Council will hold a public hearing on the proposed reconstruction of Park Street, S.E., on November 30. The proposed project includes the reconstruction of the roadway from Maple Avenue to Fardale Street, addition of curb and gutter, installation of sidewalk on the west side of the street, and installation of storm drainage structures and pipe.

NOVEMBER 1977 – The Town has received its long-awaited city status study, which concludes that, although there would be certain advantages in becoming a city, it is unlikely that any significant decrease in the present combined Town/County tax rate could be achieved, and that, under adverse conditions, the tax rate for city status could well be higher. The unfavorable fiscal impact would be largely attributable to the cost of establishing and operating an independent city school system.

Fall Lawn Care Tips

Did you know that fall is the best time to fertilize your lawn? Get your lawn ready now to look great next spring, and you'll have more time when the weather warms up to get out and enjoy yourself!

Leave grass clippings on the lawn after mowing. Nitrogen from the clippings will nourish the soil, which means you'll need less fertilizer.

Hold off on fertilizer until fall to avoid creating weak roots. Excessive fertilizer won't help your lawn; it will weaken it and send runoff into the Chesapeake Bay where crabs and oysters are already at risk.

Get a soil test to find out the best type and amount of fertilizer for your yard.

Apply it right. Use only the amount of fertilizer you really need. Too much fertilizer will actually weaken your lawn. Keep fertilizer off paved surfaces and don't apply it before it rains. Otherwise, you'll just be sending the fertilizer – and your money – down the drain.

What's the scoop on composting? Compost is not only a good alternative to fertilizer, it's an excellent soil conditioner. Yards that use compost need less water and fertilizer, so you save money.

Recycled Cell Phones Help U.S. Troops Call Home

The officers of the Vienna Police Department are continuously collecting used cell phones to benefit our troops overseas. Cell Phones for Soldiers is a program whereby old, out-of-service cell phones may be put to good use. Phones may be dropped off 24 hours a day, 7 days a week at police headquarters, 215 Center St., S.

The phones are then shipped free of charge to Missouri by FedEx and recycled by ReCellular Inc., which converts the value of the donated phone's recyclable parts into cash to buy calling cards. The cards are then shipped overseas to soldiers serving in the Middle East. This is a great way to get some good use out of an old, unused cell phone and allow those that serve our country to call home to their loved ones.

All makes and models of cell phones and accessories are accepted. Your donation is tax deductible and donation receipts are available at the drop-off location inside police headquarters.

Comment from the Council Table

A Tribute to Former Councilman Vince Olson

My fellow citizens, I had actually planned a different article for the November Town Newsletter. Normally, most members of Council use this column as a forum to inform Vienna citizens on current events in town or report on current issues as they happen. This article will be different in that it is a tribute to a great man. A few weeks ago, Vienna lost a dear friend and leader with the passing of Vincent James Olson. For six of my eleven years on Council, I served with Vince, and it is my hope that I can impart to you the Vince Olson I came to know and respect.

First of all, Vince and Valerie Olson have lived and raised a family in Vienna for 50 years. Vince was a retired *Washington Post* newspaper distributor. After serving on the Town Planning Commission, Vince was elected to the Vienna Town Council in 1976 and originally served until 1988. He was called back into service on the Town Council in 1989, to fill out the unexpired term of Richard Fisher, who had been elected to the Virginia House of Delegates. Dick recalled, "In my Council service with Vince, I found him to be a

steadying influence and a man of great personal integrity. Vince would always handle issues directly with the Town staff and not use the Council dais for self promotion." Vince served on Council until he retired in 2003. He was a member of the Ayr Hill Lions Club and Historic Vienna, Inc.

Each member of Council brings their personal and professional experiences to the table during their service. Also, in my experience, Council members develop their knowledge in certain areas of interest and Vince was no different in this regard. Every major construction project undertaken by the Town during the last 26 years, Vince Olson played a major role in developing. Vince was very knowledgeable in construction materials and construction contracts and was not afraid to ask the contractors and engineers the hard questions. His leadership and direction on projects like the new Police Department building, the Community Center renovation, the Maple Avenue Streetscape Project Phases I & II and the new Public Works facility were invaluable. He is described by Jack Mitchell, President of the Westbriar Civic Association, as "a person of real substance and a real genial individual." The Vince Olson I knew was often quiet, but when he spoke, everybody listened. He was able to see the seriousness and the humor in life. He truly cared about others and he put a majority of his life into service to our Town and is one of the ones who helped foster the true Town atmosphere we all enjoy. I am honored to have known him and I am humbled to have served with him. On behalf of all of us at Town Hall, may I express our condolences and gratitude to Valerie and the entire Olson family.




